Conversations about school

When you think of parent involvement, do you picture moms and dads volunteering in classrooms? That's one way to help-but research shows that supporting your child's education at home is even more important. Here are conversation starters that will help you stay involved.

"Let's see what you brought home" – Look at completed work to find out what your child is learning and how well she's doing. You could comment on her math work or social studies project, for instance ("You know a lot about our state's history!")

"Show me what you have for homework"- It's your child's job to do his/her homework, but you play a role, too. Make sure he knows what he's supposed to do by having him explain the assignments to you. After they finish their homework, glance over the work to see that it's complete.

"Describe a book you enjoyed today"- This gives you an idea of what your student prefers to read. Then, build a daily reading habit by asking what he or she would like to read tonight. Encourage reading and listening skills by reading aloud to them and letting read to you.

"Tell me what you learned that you'd like to know more about"
Use their interests as a jumping off point for activities to share..
