

SENIOR SNIPPET

If your child is a high school senior planning for college or career training, it's almost time to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA is the key to unlocking financial help—including grants, scholarships, work-study, and low-interest loans. Many colleges also require it before awarding their own aid.



Here are a few tips to make the process easier for families:

- Start early. Some aid is first-come, first-served, so don't delay!
- Gather documents in advance. You'll need Social Security numbers, tax returns, bank statements, and records of any untaxed income.
- Create your FSA IDs. Both you and your student need an FSA ID to sign electronically.
- Review before submitting. Double-check information to avoid errors.
- Use available resources. School counselors, financial aid offices, and local FAFSA workshops can guide you step by step.

Filling out the FAFSA may feel overwhelming, but it's an important investment in your child's future opportunities. Starting early and staying organized will make the process much smoother.




MIDTERM

ADVICE WITH AMI

Elementary school is the perfect time to help children develop strong study habits that will support them for years to come. By building routines now, students gain confidence, independence, and a positive attitude toward learning.



Here are a few simple tips to get started:

- Create a study space. Set aside a quiet, well-lit area that's free of distractions like TV or devices.
- Establish a routine. Encourage your child to do homework at the same time each day so it becomes a natural part of their schedule.
- Break it into chunks. Younger children focus better with shorter sessions try 15–20 minutes with a short break in between.
- Stay organized. Help your child use folders, bins, or checklists to keep track of assignments and supplies.
- Encourage effort, not just results. Praise hard work, persistence, and progress to build motivation.

By supporting your child with structure and encouragement, you're helping them form skills that will last well beyond elementary school. Small, consistent habits today make a big difference tomorrow!
